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Preface

You might be wondering, “Why forty days?” It rained forty days while Noah was in the ark. Moses was forty days upon the mountain. Joshua, Caleb, and the spies searched the land for forty days. And, of course, Jesus was both in the wilderness and walked in a resurrected body for forty days. These and other “forty-day” experiences were used of God to make history and mold lives. Also, this length of time can prove to work in the establishing of new patterns and habits of behavior.

If you have only one Bible verse memorized, it is very likely John 3:16 KJV. “*For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.*” The Apostle Paul prays that those in Ephesus might grasp how wide, long, deep, and high is God’s love for them in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 3:14-21). The great apostle goes on to state that it is the love of Christ that compels us (2 Corinthians 5:14). The churches of Ephesus, Sardis, and Laodicea all struggled with a lack of spiritual passion (Revelation 2, 3). I believe that if the heart is right, we can get most everything else right. Spiritual lethargy is a cause of so much sin and hurt. No matter whether we have “left our first love,” “have a reputation for being alive, but are dead,” or “are lukewarm,” it is sickening to God, and we are less than effective.

We call it renewal. It is the restoration of spiritual passion. The desire and goal is that over the next forty days God might forgive us, shine upon us, and restore our devotion, love, and passion for Him. May these be days of spiritual formation, preparation, and renewal.

If Jesus carries and the Lord grants you life, may the next forty days be *Forty Days of Passion*. “Our Great High Priest” is a daily study of the Book of Hebrews.

Pray for eyes to see and ears to hear these teachings from these Scriptures. May the experience of these forty days deepen faith, increase love, and truly be forty days of passion.

Introduction

“What do you want for Christmas?” Many ask this question at the holiday season each year. I am sure that you have been asked, “What do you want for your birthday?” “What do you want for supper?” This is a common question at our house. What do you want? The Apostle Paul answers this question in Philippians 3:10, 11, *“That I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death, if, by any means, I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.”* Hebrews 12:2, 3 states, *“Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne Of God. For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls.”* The goal of this study is to focus upon Christ and spiritual formation as recorded in the book of Hebrews. The schedule for this time of spiritual emphasis allows us to consider the entire book of Hebrews.

During these forty days you are being asked to faithfully complete all the daily studies and journaling. You will need to record your reflections, meditations, spiritual insights, journaling, written prayers and a spiritual concept, “Key Thought”, each day. Get a prayer partner and join a small group. Make prayer a priority. Give yourself to the reading, studying, meditating and memorizing of God’s Word. Be faithful in personal daily study, group life, and corporate worship. Commit to the concept of worshiping God daily. Ask God each day what adjustments He would have you make in your attitudes, actions, and feelings. Ask the question, “Dear Lord, what do you have in mind?” Those you need to forgive, forgive. If you have offended another, be reconciled. The “one thing you lack” or whatever is undone, complete it and make it right.

While seeking to accurately handle the Scriptures, the focus of this work is and remains devotional not scholarly. May it inspire, encourage and challenge you in spiritual formation and renewal.

These forty days ought to be an adventure in discovery and faith by the truth of His Word and by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Getting Started

Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest is a program of study and reflection. However, it is more than a program; it is a process. Spiritual growth is a process. These forty days will require that you study and do more than study. It must be something that you desire and that you give yourself fully to as you ask God to change you for His glory, your good, and the good of others. This season is a time when we lay aside pride, hypocrisy, selfishness, personal interests, and ask God to work in us, to transform us that He might work through us for the sake of His Kingdom.

Make the study times a priority. Set a time and place when and where you can “get alone with God.” Commit to pray. As your church might embrace and promote prayer groups, celebration services, solemn assemblies, days of fasting, or small group meetings, commit to them. Be a part, a vital part. Be a leader. I am issuing a special challenge to men. Commit to be the spiritual leader in your home for these forty days. Do the studies individually and come together regularly to lead your family in reflection and prayer!

Make a commitment to listen to God (see Study Help One) and to make adjustments according to what He reveals to you. Each day, you are to journal your thoughts, reflections, commitments, biblical concepts, responses, and prayers. The journaling is not optional. Be careful regarding your commitments. It is better not to make a vow, than to make a vow and not fulfill it (Ecclesiastes 5:5).

Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest is designed to promote spiritual formation and renewal beginning seven weeks before Resurrection Sunday. God does not change (Malachi 3:6). All of our worship is a focus upon and response to who God is and what God has done. Consider *Forty Days of Passion* as a way to worship God daily. The focus of this year’s *Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest* is a study of the Book of Hebrews. Allow the scripture and daily studies to inform the process of spiritual formation...*till Christ is formed in you. Galatians 4:19*

Psalm 51; 1 Timothy 2:1-5; 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-19; Isaiah 40:8

Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest is the twenty-fourth “forty-day” study that I have prepared for the purpose of spiritual formation and renewal. *Forty Days of Passion*, the original work, focused on selected Bible passages and emphasized the basic spiritual disciplines. *Forty Days of Passion: The Son of Man* focused on the biblical passages where Jesus is referred to as the “Son of Man.” *Look and Live* concentrated upon Jesus in every book of the Old Testament. *Learn of Me* was on the parables of Jesus. *Grace and Truth* was a study of the life of Jesus as recorded in the Gospel according to John. *Teach us to Pray*, focused on prayer. *Your Kingdom Come* dealt with the teachings of the Kingdom of God. *You Will Receive Power*, was on the Holy Spirit. *Above All Else*, was about the heart, *Worship Him* on worship and *My Holy Mountain* on spiritual experiences on mountain tops in the Bible. *Hosanna* was on the last week of Jesus’ life and *Miraculous Signs* on the miracles of Jesus as recorded in the Gospels. *Red Letter Days* was on the words and sayings of Jesus the next year on *The Cross*. *Upon This Rock* and the sequel were about the Church. *That You May Know* focused on the Gospel according to Luke, next was *Christ and the Psalms*. Additional books were *At Once*, a study of the Gospel of Mark as well as *In Christ*. These and all the studies were built around biblical texts, spiritual disciplines, practical application, daily journaling, and focus on the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. These books relied heavily upon appendices referred to as *Study Helps*.

The *Forty Days* books and experiences are designed to be spiritual pilgrimages. Spiritual formation and renewal take place individually, as couples, in families, in groups, and in the church. Spiritual formation and renewal can best be moved along with personal accountability and significant levels of social support.

Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest: focuses on the Book of Hebrews. Allow the daily studies, written prayers, journaling, meditating along with the mutual sharing, be an enriching time of spiritual formation and renewal. The heart of what it means to be a disciple is to be a learner. The *Study Helps* in the back of the book should be read thoroughly before beginning. ***Pray Hard, Work Hard, Trust God!***

Matthew 11:28-30; 2 Timothy 2:15; Romans 12:1, 2

Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest, is the twenty fourth in a series of forty-day studies. All the studies have focused on spiritual formation, preparation, and renewal. This forty-day pilgrimage is designed and prepared to accomplish three key purposes. The first is to inform and inspire the student regarding the significant role of spiritual formation. Second is to challenge the forty-day participant to discover and embrace certain spiritual concepts, transforming principles and to live more fully under the influence of the Holy Spirit in light of God's Word. The third is to enrich the life and experience of the individual in the matter of spiritual formation, renewal, and preparation, especially in daily disciplines, group life, and the church.

Each week in corporate worship we join together and pray as a congregation the model or Lord's Prayer. I am always reflective and thoughtful about praying such concepts as God forgiving us as we forgive others, praying for daily bread, and especially about asking God that His kingdom come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Especially, that it might mean that God's will be accomplished through us.

We know that it is God's will that we be born of the Spirit, filled with the Spirit, and that we walk by the Spirit. We also know that we are to love God with all our hearts and our neighbors as ourselves. This can best happen as we open our lives to the truth of His Word, the Bible, and as we yield our lives to the influence of the Holy Spirit.

I will ask you in each daily study to think, reflect, and meditate in order to discover one key concept, one spiritual reality, the just one thing that I am calling "Key Thought." It is up to the 40 Days student, led by the Word of God and prompted by the Spirit of God, to identify the key lesson for the day. The lesson for the day is the one thing, above all others, upon which you need to reflect, meditate and apply. The "Key Thought" will be the last entry you make for the day after the memorization section, and before writing your prayer for the day. After you have decided upon your one main thought, "Key Thought" for the day check *Study Help Forty-Three Key Thought* just to see if what the Lord put on your heart is somewhat close to what God put on mine for that day.

Each day will begin with an assigned portion of Scripture to read. That is the place to begin. Read the assigned passage without interruption and without consulting any Bible study helps or notes.

I trust that God *will* speak to you through His Word, the Bible. Please take time now to read *Study Help One- Hearing from God-Hearing God*.

Please remember that the point of this forty-day emphasis is spiritual formation. The purpose is not that you merely gain biblical information but that you experience adjustment, change, and spiritual transformation. Please take time now to read *Study Help Two, A Heart for God*. Reflect and pray about what it means for you personally and specifically to have a heart for God. Pick one trait to focus on and refer to this study help throughout the course of these forty days.

Two of the challenges of any forty-day study experience are the use of time and dealing with distractions. While there is no such thing as “time management” there is such a thing as “self-management.” Each and all of us have 24 hours in the day, 168 hours in the week and 960 hours in these forty days. How will you use them? Please take time to read *Study Help Three-How to Prepare Your Heart for Revival*.

The study helps can go a long way in challenging you to make adjustments, changes, repentance, and experience transformation. Jesus’ words to the Rich Young Ruler were, “one thing you lack.” For you it might be just one thing, or it may be a number of things, that crowd out God, His Word, prayer, ministry, service, worship, people and other godly influences and callings in your life.

As the purpose of *Forty Days of Passion: Our Great High Priest* is spiritual formation, renewal, and preparation, consider this portion of the “Getting Started” as preparation for preparation. Take this opportunity to get serious, get excited, and to adjust your calendar and commitments, as you trust God for great things! Pray and ask God to reveal His biblical truth to you as you study, reflect, meditate, pray and implement.

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Read *Study Help Twenty-Three* on how to study the Bible. For each passage of Scripture, you will make observations (investigation) of the text and do the explanation phase by interpreting those observations by writing a brief paraphrase that puts the main idea in your own words. After Connection and Meditation, Implementation will be completed as you note specific actions you take or adjustments you make. As you journal, you will be asked to identify a “key” verse, phrase, words or word. All Scripture is inspired but at times there are those Scriptures or Scripture portions that really stand out. As the Lord might give you a “special verse” or “special phrase” you will note as you journal. Be sure to take time to meditate on what you have observed and write a prayer inspired by that day’s study. Allow this exercise to be an open and honest expression of your heart. Read Psalm 19:12-14. At the close of the daily study in the Memorization section, you will be asked to identify your Key Thought. This should be the main lesson or take away from the passage. Blessings and best wishes as you train for the purpose of godliness, 1 Timothy 4:7-8.

Daily Assignments Explained

Take time to thoroughly read *Study Help Twenty-Three*, the *Seven-Fold Plan for Bible Study*. Much of the daily assignments depend upon your mastery of these principles of Bible study. Each day you will have a Scripture portion that is assigned. That portion is what you are supposed to focus upon. The daily studies are selected passages taken from the Book of Hebrews. Some principles are obvious and others you will have to “pull out.” Stay focused to look for the timeless truths. Let’s consider the component parts.

Appreciation – “Love It” Psalm 119:159

Perspective is everything. It is imperative that one understands that the Holy Bible is the Word of God. See Isaiah 40:8 and 2 Timothy 3:16,17. As you begin the study each day ask God to speak to you from His Word, the Holy Bible. See Study Help One.

Investigation – “See It!” Proverbs 24: 30-34

Note your observations below.

This is the discovery phase. Make as many observations of the passage as possible. You cannot learn what you do not observe. If you do not “see it” you cannot apply or pass it along. Two things will not change as you do these studies. The first is the fact that every verse or passage has a context. Do not hesitate to look ahead and behind the Scripture in question to gain additional information. Look for correlating passages to compare and contrast. See Connection-” Know It” in each daily study.

When you get started, I encourage you to do the investigation phase of the daily study and put the booklet aside for a while. Come back after that and make new observations. It is always amazing to see what you observe from the text by means of a second look.

Do not be reluctant to ask a question for which you do not know the answer or to note a word that is unfamiliar to you. Remember, this portion of the daily assignment is simply and purely investigation. You are to observe and study through close examination. Try to see as much, ask as much, and think as much as you can. Remember that this step is to be done with only your Bible and your booklet. In fact, I encourage you to

use a Bible without helps, notes, reference markers, and the like. The very real tendency is to “short cut” the process by looking to the helps and notes too soon. See and discover all you can. Ask God to show you His truths from His Word, the Bible. The challenge comes with the excitement of discovery, the discovery of God’s powerful truth as revealed in Scripture.

Explanation– “Say It!” Nehemiah 8:8

Write the main idea in your own words.

To begin this phase answer as many questions, define as many words, and clarify as many relationships as you can on your own. Once you have exhausted your knowledge, then and only then, is it time to go to the helps. Have them on hand and get them ready. A good study Bible, Bible dictionary, English dictionary, Bible concordance, Bible commentaries, other Bible translations, internet sources, and Bible apps can all be useful.

Remember that the theme of this study is *Our Great High Priest*. Try to look at everything through “spiritual” lenses. You will need to be open to the many references and practical spiritual lessons. Do not refrain from considering the mind, will, and emotions as you look for spiritual insights. Remember the challenge is to *think, act, and feel* in new ways. I am asking you to identify the main idea in the passage and to put it in your own words. It is at this point that you will begin to face a new but good challenge. To identify the main idea might be as much Spirit led as it is Bible fed. It is a real challenge to put the main idea in your own words. This is called a *paraphrase*. It has been said that it is only when you can put a passage in your own words that you truly understand what the passage means. If *investigation* is discovering what the passage says, then *explanation* is determining and stating what the passage means.

Your prayer/accountability partner and your home, small group, or class can be very helpful at this point. *As iron sharpens iron, so a man sharpens the countenance of his friend*, Proverbs 27:17, and so you need to hear the insights of others. Remember the two great challenges are determining the main idea and then putting it into your own words. If you can’t say it, do you really know it?

It can also be helpful to go back to the passage after having left it alone for a while. Also, it can be interesting to see how your thoughts on the *explanation* of the passage may change the further you get into the study. Remember, “*Openness to challenge is opportunity to change.*” Always be open to new and additional ideas and to new and better ways of saying them. Remember that in the case of the paraphrase, “less is more.” The fewer words in a paraphrase, generally the better.

Connection – “Know It!” Note any other verses that complement what you studied today.

The best commentary on the Bible is the Bible. In this portion of the study write any verses the Lord brings to mind that relate to, complement, explain, comment upon, or harmonize with the passage of Scripture that you have studied today. Once you have done this you may use such helps as a center column reference or footnotes in your Bible but only do so after you have looked up and read the verses on your own.

Volumes are packed in the little five-word phrase “close your time in prayer.” Do not let this portion of the time be incidental or accidental. The prayer component should be strategic, intentional, and powerful. I encourage you to reference and read thoroughly *Study Helps Fourteen* through *Twenty-Two* concerning prayer.

Now it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, “Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.”
Luke 11:1

Pray without ceasing. 1 Thessalonians 5:17

Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving. Colossians 4:2
Then He spoke a parable to them, that men always ought to pray and not lose heart.
Luke 18:1-8.

Please pray for God’s kingdom to come and His will to be done. And personally pray for the knowledge of God’s will for your life and for the courage, power, and perseverance to carry it out.

At the end of each study will be a “**Key Thought**” section where you are to write the main idea, the key spiritual insight for the day. This is the truth that you have learned that day about God, the things of God, and Jesus Christ, put in your own words.

Be sure and check your concept with what I have written in study help forty-three “Key Thoughts.” May God richly bless you as you think, act, and feel in new ways as Christ is formed in you. Galatians 4:19

I trust that these will be days of spiritual formation, renewal, and preparation. Enjoy the journey. Be blessed and be a blessing. May you grow in grace and truth and in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Meditation – “Ponder It!” Upon reflection, journal your key verse, phrase, words, or word in the space below.

Psalm 1:2. God speaks through His Word, the Bible. As you do the daily studies you will discover that there will be certain verses, or thoughts within a verse, that just seem to “jump out” at you. Don’t just look for the familiar but also consider the lesser-known portions as well. Some days it might be a verse, some days a phrase, and yet other days it will only be a word. In the realm of the profound often we find that less is more. Ask the Lord to guide you. The goal of this step is to ponder, reflect upon, and consider what God is saying to you.

Some days the “key” verse or thought will be obvious and irresistible. On other days you will need to look for it. Nevertheless, be sensitive to what the Holy Spirit will speak through the Bible. Please see Study Help Twenty-Five and Study Help Twenty-Six to learn more on meditation and memorization. By looking for a “key” verse or phrase you might better unlock the meaning of the passage and meditate upon it, see Joshua 1:8.

Implementation – “Do It!” Think, act, and feel in new ways. List any changes or adjustments that you need to make.

“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.” James 1:22
The Nike Corporation has had a slogan for a long time that reminds us of the importance of action, “Just Do It!” The name of the company comes from the Greek word that means “victory.” In order to be victorious in life you must do what the Bible says.

In my office there is an art object that says, *“Change is good, you go first.”* It is very easy to point out the faults and flaws in others but to miss or be unwilling to deal with our own. James 1:25 states that whoever looks

intently into the Bible and does and keeps on doing what it says will be truly blessed. In applying the Bible to our lives, we make personal, measurable, and specific changes. Another art object in my office states “*Motivated People Find a Way!*”

Notice, if you will, the three-fold challenge of **think, act, and feel in new ways**. The Bible says we are transformed by the renewing of our minds, Romans 12:2. We have just seen that it is when we act upon what the Bible says and keep on doing it that we are truly blessed. Notice, that feelings come last. Make every attempt to keep them there. Feelings change frequently so never allow yourself to be ruled by your feelings. Many people just want to feel better, not get better. The real goal is to get better and as a result you will feel better. Two popular Christian psychologists remind us that real, lasting, and spiritual change requires grace, truth, and time.

Growth is a process and change comes by steps, “baby steps.” I encourage you to select no more than one item, step, change or application per day. If the study brings up more than one, pick one and start there. Spiritual formation comes when you are overwhelmed by your own personal need for change and transformation. It is here, in the implementation phase, that you deal with confession, repentance, godly sorrow, forgiveness, acceptance and other core issues of spiritual transformation and renewal. You may wish to incorporate *Study Help Twenty-Two - Praying the Virtues of Scripture*. Ask God to change you. Remember, the goal is to **think, act and feel in new ways**.

Memorization “Recall It”

Commit to memory a key word, phrase, or verse.

Psalm 119:11 “A short pencil is better than a long memory.” Be sure and journal, make a note of what it is that you want to commit to memory. We tend to remember the things that are important to us. Write a prayer prompted by your meditation.

Journal your reflections and write a prayer prompted by today’s study. As you journal your insights, reflections, impressions, or commitments, as you seek to think, act, and feel in new ways. Do not just read the words but study the Bible text for what is being communicated about Bible knowledge, practical Christian living, and the key phrase “Key Thought”

spiritual insight. Let your thoughts flow. Some days it may be a truth you grab and other days it may be a truth that grabs you. All is grist for the mill.

Baptists and evangelicals have not been known for written prayers. Reference Acts 4:23-31 and see how Scripture, experience, passion, and desire impacted this prayer of the early church. Do not miss the fact that this is a written prayer. This discipline may be challenging at first, but I am hoping that this exercise will be enriching and empowering to you personally, to your prayer partners, your group, and to your church. The written prayers do not have to be long. Remember, it is better to have heart without words than words without heart. Be sure and use the Saturday reflection time to re-read your prayers for the week. Also, let your Bible intake and meditation upon it inform the prayers you write. Consider using some of the *Names of God, Study Help Five*, as you address the Lord in your written prayer.

The word here for meditate is *hagah*, to murmur or ponder.

Meditate on these things; give yourselves entirely to them, that your progress may be evident to all. 1 Timothy 4:15 NKJV

The word meditate is *meletao*, take care of, revolve in the mind.

Biblical meditation is a spiritual pursuit and discipline for spiritual growth, formation and transformation. It is *not* some kind of mystical, empty headed, palms up, New Age endeavor. It is pondering, reflecting and seriously considering the things of God in order that you may better implement and adjust to God, God's Will and God's Word.

1. God-*"Consider Him,"* Hebrews 12:3
2. Scripture-*"in His law he meditates day and night."* Psalm 1:2
3. Creation-*"when I consider your heavens."* Psalm 8:3

5. Virtues-*"whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, praiseworthy, think about such things."*

Hiding God's Word in Your Heart
Memorization

The disciples asked Jesus, “Lord increase our faith,” and without faith it is impossible to please God. The resources of faith are the Word of God (the Bible), prayer, and service. The practice of the disciplines of the Christian life can be linked to and flow from these three powerful resources. One of the areas of discipline is that of Scripture memory. To grow and increase as a committed follower of Jesus Christ you must hide God’s Word in your heart.

1. Consider Jesus. Read *Matthew 4:1-11*. Jesus practiced Scripture memory.
2. “I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you” (*Psalms 119:11*).
3. Make a commitment. Determine to make Scripture memory a part of your life.
4. Have a system. You may use cards, a notebook, a computer, or whatever system works for you. Your system should provide a functional plan.
5. Start simply. Start with single verses. Move from that point to multiple verses and passages of Scripture. “All Scripture is profitable,” but begin with that “special” verse that you have always wanted to put to memory. Advance from that point.
6. Give time to your verse every day for six days, several times a day. Review the verse one day a week for six weeks. Then review the verse every six weeks. Review the old as you add the new.
7. Hide God’s Word in your heart, not just in your head. Ponder and apply what you memorize.

The word *submit* in the New Testament is the Greek word *hupotasso*. The prefix *hupo* means under, and the word *tasso* means to arrange. Submission in the New Testament means to arrange in an orderly fashion under the authority of another.

Another word used in this context means to hear under and is often translated to obey.

Directions for Singing by John Wesley

Learn these tunes before you learn any others, afterwards learn as many as you please.

Sing them exactly as they are printed here, without altering or mending them at all; and if you have learned to sing them otherwise, unlearn it as soon as you can.

Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a slight degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up, and you will find it to be a blessing.

Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength. Be no more ashamed of its being heard, than when you sung the songs of Satan.

Sing modestly. Do not bawl, so as to be heard above or distinct from the rest of the congregation, that you may not destroy the harmony; but strive to unite your voices together, so as to make one clear melodious sound

Sing in time. Whatever time is sung be sure to keep with it. Do not run before nor stay behind it; but attend close to the leading voices and move therewith as exactly as you can; and take care not to sing too slow. This drawling way naturally steals on all who are lazy; and it is high time to drive it out from us and sing all our tunes just as we did at first.

Above all sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing Him more than yourself, or any other creature. In order to do this, attend strictly to the sense of what you sing, and see that your heart is not carried away with the sound, but offered to God continually; so, shall your singing be such as the Lord will approve here, and reward you when He cometh in the clouds of heaven. 1. **Believe** - You must believe that Jesus died for you and is alive today. You must also believe that Jesus is the only way for you to get to heaven.

The Bible says, “Yet to all who received him (Jesus), to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God” (John 1:12).

2. **Repent** - Understand that you sin (disobey God) and you must turn from your sin. To repent, tell God you have sinned, ask Him to forgive you and to help you obey and please Him. The Bible says, “Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out” (Acts 3:19).
3. **Receive** - You must invite Jesus to come into your life to be your Lord and Savior. By inviting Him, you are promising to obey Him in all areas of your life.

You can accept God’s gift by praying a single prayer. When you do this, God forgives and removes the sin that has separated you from Him. Then Jesus comes to live in you as Savior and Lord. You become a part of God’s family.

The Bible says, “**Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved**” (Romans 10:13).

Pursue righteousness and a godly life. Ask God to change your life and to make you more like Jesus. Say no to the bad and yes to the good.

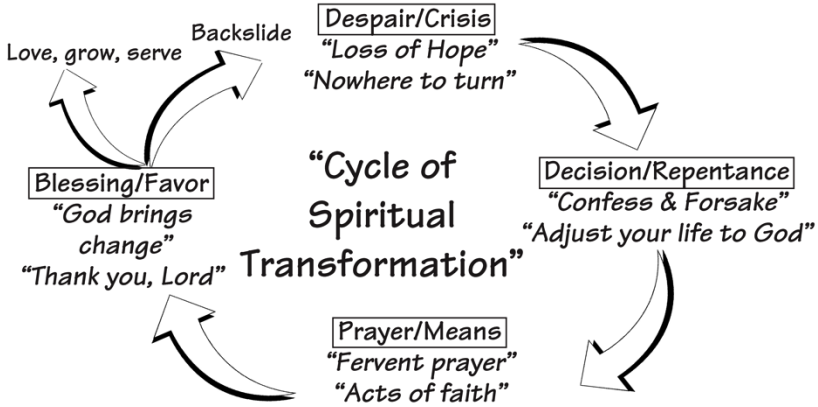

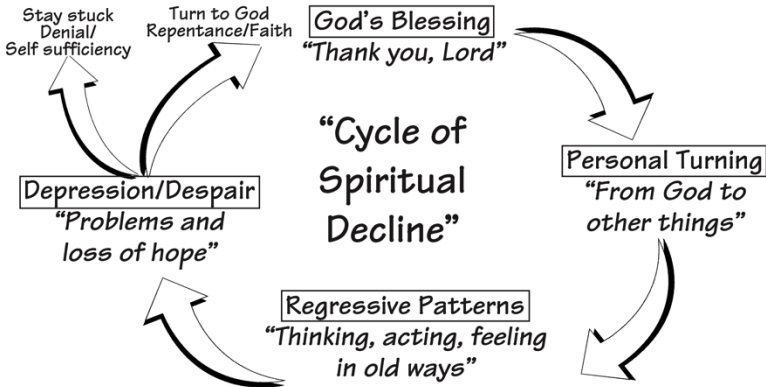
Cycles of Spiritual Transformation & Decline

Digging Deeper - Session One

Day One

Hebrews 1:1-14

Ice Breaker Activity: *First Things First – Open With Prayer*

I remember my mom saying, “that’s why you have two ears and one mouth.” Share in the group some of the sayings you remember from parents, grandparents and other influential adults. Which saying was the most memorable or impactful and why?

Hebrews 1:1-2 refers to God speaking. See Study Help One *Hearing God* and discuss how God speaks to us.

See Deuteronomy 6:4. This is the Great Shama, *Hear O Israel*. Discuss some practical ways that we can listen well and become better hearers.

Read aloud Hebrews 1:3-4. List some of the attributes and actions of Jesus according to this passage. Having done so list some other attributes and actions of Jesus that you can think of off-hand.

There are multiple references from the Old Testament in the Book of Hebrews. Do a cross-reference Bible search and identify the Old Testament references in this chapter and discuss what they state.

Read aloud Hebrews 1:14. Discuss what this verse informs regarding angels. See Hebrews 13:1-2.

Key Thought-Spiritual Insight – Share with the group your main takeaway from this passage and close your time in prayer.

Digging Deeper - Session Two

Day Eight

Hebrews 4:8-13

Ice Breaker Activity: *First Things First – Open With Prayer*

The word *effort* can be defined as a vigorous, determined attempt. Share with the group a time that you put your whole heart into an effort. What was it, what was your purpose or goal, why did you do it and how did it work out for you? If you could get a “do over” how might you improve?

The word *today* appears twice in Hebrews 4:7 and multiple times in the Book of Hebrews. Share in your group the importance of staying in the moment, taking advantage of opportunities as they arise and not procrastinating.

Hebrews 4:8 references Joshua. Read aloud Joshua 1:6, 7, 9, 18. What two virtues are being emphasized? Discuss the importance of these virtues for daily Christian living.

Hebrews 4:9 states the concept of Sabbath rest. Discuss in your group the concept and principle of Sabbath and ways Christians can practice Sabbath rest in practical and beneficial ways.

Read aloud Hebrews 4:12. Share in your group the benefits and beauty of God’s Word. Allow Psalm 19:7-11, 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and other passages to help inform your discussion.

Key Thought-Spiritual Insight – Share with the group your main takeaway from this passage and close your time in prayer

Ice Breaker Activity: *First Things First – Open With Prayer*

A popular newspaper writer once searched across the state of Texas for the “ultimate enchilada.” Share in your group your favorite Mexican food restaurant, your favorite entrée and what makes each your choice. Got any memories to go along with these?

Read individually and silently Hebrews 7:1-28. Record your insights below.

The best commentary on the Bible is the Bible. Read aloud Genesis 14:18-20 and Psalm 110:4. The name Melchizedek is a combination of the words king and priest. This biblical figure was both a king and a priest. Discuss how these fit as pictures of Jesus Christ.

In this seventh chapter of the Book of Hebrews we find words or phrases that are repeated in the Book of Hebrews. See Hebrews 7:19, 22 for the word “better” and Hebrews 7:27 for the phrase “once for all.” Discuss how Jesus fulfills both.

Read aloud Hebrews 7:25. Enjoy listing and discussing ways that Jesus “saves completely or saves to the uttermost.” Truly Jesus is our one and only King, our one and only Great High Priest, and our one and only Savior. Remember, Jesus is praying for you. Discuss what it is that He might be praying.

Key Thought-Spiritual Insight – Share with the group your main takeaway from this passage and close your time in prayer.

Digging Deeper - Session Four

Day Twenty-Two

Hebrews 9:23-28

Ice Breaker Activity: *First Things First - Open With Prayer*

Share with the group your favorite vacation of all time. Where did you go, with whom did you go, and what made it great? Also, consider a place that you would like to visit. Remember the root word for the word vacation is the word *vacate!*

Read individually and silently Hebrews 9:1-28. Note your observations below then share one insight with the group.

Certain key words and phrases have been noted in previous Digging Deeper lessons. Focus on and discuss the significance of the following Hebrews 9: 12, 26 – “Once For All” –

Hebrews 9:14 – “How Much More” –

Hebrews 9:15 – “Mediator” –

Hebrews 9:15 – “Ransom” –

Hebrews 9:23 – “Better” –

One Bible commentator has suggested that the Book of Hebrews can be summed up in two statements regarding Jesus: Hebrews 6:19 “within the veil” and Hebrews 13:11 “without, outside, the camp.” What do you think?

Key Thought-Spiritual Insight – Share with the group your main takeaway from this passage and close your time in prayer.

Digging Deeper - Session Five

Day Twenty-Nine

Hebrews 11:8-19

Ice Breaker Activity: *First Things First – Open With Prayer*

Share with the group your favorite season, time of the year or holiday and why. Also, share one memory from your favorite time, season or holiday.

Read Hebrews 11:1-40 individually and silently. Upon completion note the number of times the phrase “by faith” appears.

Read aloud Hebrews 11:6, Galatians 5:6 and Ephesians 2:8-9. Discuss in the groups the important lessons that can be learned from these verses.

Look up a definition of the word “faith.” Individually write in the space below your own paraphrase or description of the word “faith” or what it means to believe. Share your insights with the group.

Read aloud Hebrews 11:8-19 concerning Father Abraham, The Friend of God. Discuss some lessons of faith that can be gained here.

Read aloud Luke 17:1-6 and consider the request of the disciples in verse 5. Discuss the role of faith in the life of the believer and consider adding to your prayers. ‘Lord, increase our faith.’”

Key Thought-Spiritual Insight – Share with the group your main takeaway from this passage and close your time in prayer.

Digging Deeper - Session Six

Day Thirty-Six – Palm Sunday

Hebrews 12:25-29

Ice Breaker Activity: *First Things First – Open With Prayer*

Share with the group either your favorite movie or musical group. How long has it been your favorite and why or how did it become so?

Today is Palm Sunday. The beginning of what is known as Holy Week. The Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem is recorded in Matthew 21:1-11; Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:29-38; John 12:12-15. These passages are for personal study and should be looked at on your own during this Holy Week.

Read aloud Hebrews 12:25-29. Worship involves both focus and response. What does this verse state regarding worship? Discuss your insights.

Consider the phrase “let us” found in verse 29. Who is the “us”? Review Study Help Thirty – The “One Another’s” of the New Testament to sharpen our focus on the importance of “us.” Along with the singular, we need the plural. See Colossians 4:3.

The Bible includes both doctrine and application. Hebrews 13 has many exhortations as to how we should behave and practice as Christians. Have fun discovering and discussing what you find.

Key Thought-Spiritual Insight – Share with the groups your main takeaway from this passage and close your time in prayer.
